QSL means

“I confirm receipt of your transmission.”

We will cover:

- Information to Log
- QSL by Card
- QSL by LoTW
- QSL by eQSL
- QSL by OQRS

If you want to QSL, you must log at least:

- Call sign of station worked
- Date and Time (UTC)
- Frequency or Band
- Mode of 2-way contact (SSB, CW, RTTY, etc.)
- Signal Report (RST)
- Location of station worked if portable/mobile
- Your Location if portable/mobile

Optional information for you and station worked:

- Contest exchange
- County, Grid Square, CQ Zone, ITU Zone
- Special Event, IOTA, NPOTA, SOTA, etc.
- Rig, Antenna, Power, etc.
- Email address

- eQSL
- OQRS
